A LESSON FROM THE REDWOOD

A LESSON FROM STORMY WINDS

Trees make life possible. They provide shade, beauty and numerous other gifts—from the tires on our cars to the delicious juicy fruit we enjoy. But beyond meeting physical needs, trees can also teach spiritual lessons.

Biosphere 2 is a science research facility located in Oracle, Arizona. It is a miniature version of our planet, constructed for scientists to study how the planet's living systems actually work. As a result, they search for new ideas for better plant production. It is a self-contained ecosystem with an artificial atmosphere. It has controlled temperature, light, moisture, minerals, food, fertilizer and pest control. Everything is perfect for the enlarged, luscious fruit, which grows on the trees. However, a major discovery came about that was unexpected. Branches kept breaking and snapping off from the weight of the fruit. The trees continued to suffer from an unknown cause. Why? The most interesting thing learned was the importance of wind in a plant's life.

TREES NEED WIND

Trees in the biosphere were growing faster than they grow in the wild. However, it was discovered that these trees would not completely mature. The branches were brittle and inflexible—so they collapsed. The problem was a lack of wind in the biosphere, which played a major role in a tree's life. Wind makes a tree stronger, more flexible, causing it to mature and to not collapse from either their own weight or the fruit.

Stress is what makes a tree strong enough to sustain the wear and tear that it will face later on. Do you see a lesson here for humans? Consider another part of the tree—its roots.

REDWOOD WONDERS

God's Word reminds us that we are like trees planted by streams of water (Psalm 1:3). Another lesson from nature is the redwood trees—the tallest, living trees on earth. Some stand taller than a 35-story building. Like all trees, the longer it lives, the taller and wider it becomes.

The most famous redwood tree in the world is called General Sherman. Located in Sequoia National Park in California, it is almost as tall as a 30-story building. It has been in existence for nearly 4,000 years. To support its height, its immense trunk is so large that 17 men



stretching out their arms could just about reach around it. This single tree contains enough wood to be able to construct 100 homes.

Except for earthquakes, landslides and men who cut them down for timber, redwoods and sequoias have few enemies. Scientists have researched the redwoods carefully, and have not found even one that has died of 'old age,' sickness or insect attack. Redwoods are even impervious to wildfires. They have fibrous, fire-resistant bark that can grow up to two feet thick. Although fires can damage them, they usually don't kill them.

THE REDWOOD'S STRENGTH

Occasionally, giant trees fall because of a shallow root system. However, the reason redwoods fall is loneliness—standing by themselves. This is the result of cutting and removing neighboring trees. They lose a vital companion that gives them their strength. **We learn from Scripture that where there are two or more there is strength** (Matthew 18:20).

These giant redwoods make a powerful statement about protection. Despite their enormous height, their roots only go 6 to 12 feet deep into the soil. However, they make up for it in width, extending up to 100 feet from the trunk. They extend out to about one acre in all directions, which is almost the size of a football field. They do this because they grow in groups and interconnect with one another. Thus, a network of support is formed just beneath the surface. In the wildness of storms, these trees hold each other up. The strength of the team is each member. The strength of each member is the team.

Likewise, isolated individuals and ministries who do not link themselves with strong and mature ministries become easy targets for the enemy. The winds of adversity can destroy them. Being connected means each becomes accountable to others. It means that we can speak into one another's lives, especially when we see something that needs to be corrected.

ANOTHER TIMBER TESTIMONY

Another great tree is the bristlecone pine. When it succumbs to the elements of nature, and finally dies after 3,000-4,000 years, it does not decay and fall to the ground. It continues to stand for another 1,000 years or so. The elements merely wear away the bark and polish the wood until it glistens like a white statue, still testifying to the strength that comes from enduring adversity.

Like the bristlecone pine, if we are faithful through our trials, our lives will continue to testify long after we have left this earth. We will be like Abel, the righteous man whose offerings the Lord commended: *"By faith he still speaks, even though he is dead"* (Hebrews 11:4). My mom and dad, Gordon and Freda Lindsay, are two "bristlecone pines" who are still testifying long after they graduated to their eternal home.

GRACE = RECEIVE IT! GIVE IT!

o matter what problem we might have, there are good Christian books that give us steps to take care of it. My own church's bookstore is overflowing with all kinds of material to improve our relationships—how to be a better husband, wife, parent, and friend. We read these books, hoping to find a few points we can incorporate into our lives to make us better people and improve the atmosphere in our homes.

Unfortunately, we can't change ourselves into the 'perfect' people written about in the books. At least most of us can't, and we become frustrated and throw in the "I want to be a good person" towel to settle for who we have always been. That's most of us. However, there is a group disciplined enough and so goal-oriented that while we are beating ourselves up, they are beating themselves into shape. Instead of feeling bad about themselves, they are selfrighteous and arrogant.

THE GRACE OF GOD

When we come to Jesus, we know that there is no good thing in ourselves and that grace is the only way to get into God's Kingdom. It's by the unmerited favor of God and His mercy that assures us of eternal life. So, we come to Him that way, just as we are. But soon afterward, we stop living by grace and impose rules, regulations, and impossible behavioral goals that come from religious burdens.

When we forget that we are saved by grace and that in us there is no good thing, we treat others harshly in our hearts. Even if we fake it on the outside and don't say anything, we live measuring and judging, and no one ever makes the grade that we think they should.

When we understand the message of the Gospel, we see a radical change in us, but where it is most evident is in our close relationships. The fact that we arrived at the foot of the Cross, naked and ashamed, with empty hands and hearts, keeps us tender and patient with others—at least until we start to forget.

GOD'S CHILD AND CHRIST'S BRIDE

The two relationships that most affect our human relationships are:

- 1. We are God's children
- 2. We are Christ's bride.

The Father looked down on our orphaned state and took us in. He did it on purpose. He wasn't forced to and didn't have to, but He so loved the world that He did it, and now we can confidently come before Him as His children and receive protection, help, and abundant forgiveness.

Christ also loved the world. That's why He obeyed the Father and died for us—His church. We weren't perfect; far from it. Our dress was torn. We were not pure; we have made so many mistakes. Yet, He desires us for Himself. He calls the Church HIS Church, HIS body, and HIS bride.

OUR ROLE AS PARENTS, HUSBANDS, AND WIVES

We must not forget these things as spouses and parents if we want the love of God to flow through us. A harsh, domineering husband and father, who wants to rule his house like a dictator king, has forgotten that he was not worthy of the Father's adoption. In fact, the opposite is true—he had done nothing right; he was totally disobedient to all the house rules when he approached the Lord for the first time. He was not obedient and didn't even know how to obey. When he forgets this—the message of the Gospel—he takes any mistake from his wife or kids as a direct assault on him being the head of the house, which is the opposite of the love his Heavenly Father demonstrates.

A wife who is critical of her husband, always judging and finding fault, has also forgotten what the Gospel is all about. She is a bride that is unattractive at heart. She has made so many mistakes that it would be impossible to recover from them all. She ran after pleasures, one after the other, was rebellious and crude, and could not change her ways. There was nothing desirable about her. However, Jesus saw past all of this and could see in her a bride without spot or wrinkle, one He wanted as His own, His one-and-only Church.

Parents who demand perfect obedience and expect their kids to jump, when they say jump with no questions asked, no hesitation, have forgotten that they are also lawbreakers and continue to break the law on a daily basis. They ignore the basis of their salvation. These parents don't realize that they weren't perfect when they weren't saved. They were not saved because of their ability to obey God, but because they didn't. They know that the law did not change their heart, but they expect it to change their kids' hearts and heap rules and legalism on their little lives.

Children need the same grace that their parents need. They need to be transformed by the Gospel and remember that they are also sinners—imperfect—just like their parents and not expect perfection.

We all need to approach God as children and run to Christ as the bride, loved by the Father and desired by the Son. When we live this way every day, we aren't judgmental toward others. We can shower grace and mercy. We can extend love and kindness because the Perfect One has treated us so well.

When I came back to Dallas, in 2008, Mr. Shone had just gone to be with the Lord, so I worked in headquarters as the Operations Manager, Human Resources, and Purchasing. I simply went through the easiest open door that was before me, which is proof the Lord has been leading my life without me even knowing it this whole time, to get me to where I am now."

- **POLLY:** "What brought the turnaround for you and your relationship with the Lord?"
- GOLAN: "It didn't happen right away, but after I came to work here my love and passion began to grow. I would attend the Friday Night Worship sessions, and I would feel the presence of God in such a way, that it began to change me. I knew God was real, and I wanted the different life that I saw my parents living, one without depression, fear, anxiety and the ups and downs you see in the world without Jesus. I wanted Him to be in my life."
- **POLLY:** "Is this why worship is so important to you?"
- **GOLAN:** "Yes, His presence is everything. It's true worship—it's not about performance. True worship creates the intimacy we need with Him. This is where I find my peace and joy when the stress of the world tries to hit me, instead of running to the things of the world like I used to."
- **POLLY:** "So now you are in a position where the future is necessary to not only think about but plan for. What do you see happening for CFNI?"
- GOLAN: "The vision I have encompasses 7 things:
- **1. CAMPUS:** We will be rebuilding the campus with the vision that we should be a community/ family ... like the early church.
- 2. THE WORD: We must know and learn the Word to be the warriors He's called us to be. Learning that the words that come out of our mouth are more powerful than we realize, and we need

to be speaking them out. They are alive and active.

- 3. COMMUNITY: We must learn to live in a community where we are aware and can meet other's needs. A community like the early church was in the Bible.
- 4. SENT OUT: We must be willing to follow His command and be willing to "Go!" To go and not stay complacent, trying to succesfully live our everyday Christian lives, but giving our lives as sacrifices to spread His gospel.
- **5. MIRACLES:** We must be ready to present and receive the moving of the Spirit for miracles, signs, and wonders ... they are coming!
- 6. DELIVERANCE: We must find our identity in Christ to receive total and complete freedom. The students who come to CFNI now don't even know who they are or the spirits of the world they need to be delivered from ... freedom!
- 7. STAY CONNECTED: We must come back after we graduate to stay connected and to be refreshed by the family God has established here. Students come in to be trained to go into the world, to spread Jesus, and they get drained in the world, so we want them to come back periodically to be refreshed!"
- POLLY: "Krissia, I will ask you the first question I asked Golan. Did you ever think your future would be working at CFNI?"
 KRISSIA: "No, I didn't. I was an attorney in Honduras. I loved what I was doing."

POLLY: "What brought you to CFNI?"

KRISSIA: "Well, my pastors were Ricardo and Reina de Salazar in El Salvador. Ricardo was a CFNI graduate. My parents were sent out



to plant a church in Honduras, so I moved there when I was 12, and later studied law. I applied to CFNI—but wasn't accepted. Five years later I received an email from CFNI asking if I was still interested in attending. I discovered the reason I hadn't been accepted was that I needed to submit four more documents. But now I was practicing law. Did I really want to come? I prayed and received counsel from my pastors and parents, who all said 'Go!' So out of obedience, I came."

POLLY: How did you and Golan meet?

KRISSIA: "It turned out we both had signed up to go to Israel. A few days before we left, we saw each other in the cafeteria and started to talk. On the trip we spent a lot of time together—not alone but with the activities and taking walks in the evening with others."

POLLY: "Did you know 'he was the one?"

KRISSIA: "I had told God I wanted to be married and this now was five years after that time," she said laughing. "We never said we were dating. We only looked at becoming good friends. Two and a half years later, he proposed. (Krissia shared much more about the importance of remaining friends and keeping a pure and holy relationship. This will be in the Summer *VOICE* magazine. Watch for it!)

POLLY: "What is your vision for the future?"

KRISSIA: "As of November, I was asked to be the Alumni Director. I look forward to helping us stay connected in achieving all that God has planned for us to do. I still have a passion for the law, so who knows ... maybe someday! I would even like to work in that capacity with CFNI"

ecently, I was awakened with a childhood song that I learned in Sunday School. *Jesus Loves the Little Children of the World.* Their race, color or creed doesn't matter. Jesus loves them all. Healing Testimonies

Ana Carolina

My name is Ana Carolina and I'm from Brazil. I have studied at the CFNI Healing School of Ministry, and I'm happy to share my testimony and tell you what God has done in my life and in the lives of the people around me.

Some years ago my father would not allow me to go to church, and if I did, he could punish me. From 11 years old to 17 years old, my dream was to go to church. While I stayed home, I prayed for 6 years, waiting faithfully on God. God answered by changing the situation. On October 31, 2018, on Protestant Reformation Day, my father allowed me to go to church. He didn't know that Protestant Reformation was being celebrated that day. From that day on I was free to be baptized.

I was baptized on the second Sunday in December 2018, but in the week of my baptism my mother had a cerebrovascular accident. While she was still unconscious, I anointed her, and we prayed for her. In a week she was talking and walking, and she got better every day. She fully recovered and started going to church, too. She was also baptized a year later. Hallelujah! We serve a miracle-working God.

That was yesterday's miracle, but we still know that God continues to do miracles all the time—He never changes. I have learned about the power of God in the Healing classes, and I put this into practice.

I had the opportunity to teach the children of my church about missions and healing and about the power of God. At the end of the class, a little boy came to me and said he had a pain in his foot. (I thought it was a great opportunity to demonstrate God's power to those children). So, I talked to the kids and asked what they should do for him. They answered that they wanted to pray. A little girl, standing beside me, started the prayer. I put my hands on the little boy's foot and started to say, "Be healed! Be healed in the name of Jesus!" The children were so happy to pray, and three minutes later that little boy came to me and said that the pain was gone. Glory to God! I have had a wonderful and miraculous opportunity to join in the CFNI Healing School Ministry. I have experienced the power of God in these classes. My faith has grown with each class. It is in these classes that I find faith to also believe in my dream of one day becoming a CFNI full-time student, believing for the provision of God—all things are possible for Him. I believe because I have experienced miracles. God used those children to heal. God used me to heal my mother, and I have learned that if God can use me, God can use you! I challenge you to make yourself available for God. We have a big God. Dare to dream BIG! Let thy Kingdom come!

My name is Paula Christen, and I am a 4th semester student. Since Covid hit in March, I had been experiencing headaches on the right side of my head that felt like a sharp piece of glass that pierced into my jaw. They started randomly at first, but at the beginning of this semester in August they began to increaseboth in intensity and occurrence. I began missing classes because the pain was so intense, lasting all day pain. At first, I didn't tell anyone, but they just got so intense that I had to take two to four 500mg of Tylenol sometimes twice a day.

I finally visited a doctor, who referred me to a neurologist. I opened up about

it one morning during one of my classes-Theology of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Andrew Brown and the class prayed for me, as well as another professor, but I had little faith that they would be cured. Even though I have laid hands on people and saw them healed, and I have seen miraculous signs in others, for some reason, I did not think I was going to be healed.
